

**RESOLUTION #04-44**

**DISPOSAL OF CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE (“C&D”), WHITE GOODS AND SIMILAR**

**DOG ISLAND CONSERVATION DISTRICT**

**STATE OF FLORIDA**

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors (“Board”) of Dog Island Conservation District, at its duly called meeting of July 5, 2025, as follows:

**Section 1:** If C&D Materials/ White Goods etc. are to be disposed of at the dumpsters(roll off open containers) located at the DICD Shop you must first contact the Island Manager before disposing of any such materials to obtain advance approval . If approval is given the cost of disposing of said materials in this manner is \$2.00 per cubic foot payable prior to placing the materials in the dumpsters or where designated by the Island Manager.

**Section 2:** Dumpsters can possibly be brought to a residence for the disposal of C &D materials etc. To arrange for a dumpster to be brought to your residence you must contact the Island Manager. The cost of disposing C&D materials in this manner is \$1,200 for a large dumpster and \$800 for a small dumpster. The cost for the dumpster is a flat fee regardless of the volume of material placed in the dumpster. For the avoidance of doubt if you request that a small dumpster be brought to your residence you will be charged \$800 regardless of whether you fill the entire dumpster to the top or if you place only a few items in the dumpster. Conversely, if either size dumpster is filled such that the C&D material is over the top of the dumpster an additional charge of \$210 per foot will be charged to accommodate it’s removal.

**Section 3:** All deliveries of dumpsters to a residence is at the discretion of the Island Manager because of soft sand roadways and other obstacles. Additionally, a delivery fee of a minimum of \$50 and maximum of \$150 will be charged for said delivery depending on the distance and difficulty of transporting the dumpster from the DICD shop to your residence.

**Section 4:** Dumpsters are to be used exclusively for C&D and similar materials absolutely no municipal solid waste (“MSW”) or hazardous waste can be placed in the dumpsters. MSW-household kitchen/bath bagged waste must be disposed of in the DICD compactor, located near the entrance to the shop area for such purposes. Hazardous waste may not be placed in the compactor or the dumpsters and must be properly disposed of by the homeowner off the Island.
