

**RESOLUTION #7321**  
**ISLAND HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE**  
**DOG ISLAND CONSERVATION DISTRICT**  
**STATE OF FLORIDA**

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors (“Board”) of Dog Island Conservation District, at its duly called meeting of July 3, 2021, as follows:

**I. Background**

Dog Island Conservation District (“District”) is a political subdivision of the State of Florida created by Chapter 2001-304, Laws of Florida. Per its enabling legislation the DICD is designated “to enact resolutions that guide and accomplish the coordinated, balanced, and harmonious development of Dog Island in Franklin County, in accordance with existing and future needs, to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the area and its inhabitants, visitors, and property owners, to establish, maintain, and preserve aesthetic values and preserve and foster the development and display of attractiveness, and to prevent congestion and the destruction of natural beauty.

**II. Definitions**

1. “District” means the Dog Island Conservation District established by Chapter 2001-304, Laws of Florida, and previous enacting legislation.
2. “Board” means the Governing Board of the Board of Directors of the District.
3. “Resolution” means a resolution or rule as defined in Section 4(14), Chapter 2001-304, Laws of Florida.

**III. Implementation and Memorializing of DICD guidelines and rules.**

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT**


1. There is no camping of any sort allowed on Dog Island/within the District.
2. There are no open fires of any sort allowed on Dog Island/within the District without prior permission from the Fire Chief.
3. Dogs will at all times be leashed on Dog Island within the District.
4. Driving on the beach is prohibited on Dog Island within the District.
5. There is a 25mph vehicular speed limit on Dog Island /within the District.

This Resolution is for the current and long term benefit of Dog Island, the owners of real property within the Dog Island Conservation District, their guests, as well as the flora and fauna on this unique, fragile, and environmentally vulnerable barrier island.

**IV. Enforcement**

The Officers and agents of the District are authorized by the Board to take all such reasonable actions necessary to enforce this resolution.

Resolution adopted by vote of the DICD Board of Directors, July 3, 2021 and to become effective immediately.
